Pro-Chancellor \ he and Chairman, Governing Council of the Federal University of Technology, Minna, Professor Olu Obafemi, fsonta, fesan, FNAL, NNOM has praised the institution's Senate Congregation for their vibrancy.

Prof. Obafemi made this declaration on Tuesday August 3, 2021 when members of the recently inaugurated Council had an interactive session with the Senate of the University at the Auditorium, University Campus, Gidan Kwano, Minna. The members of Council had earlier met with the Congregation at the same venue where the Pro-Chancellor commended members for their active participation.

Speaking further, Prothe Chancellor disclosed that, although he had been to many universities in

Nigeria, he had never met a very robust Senate like the one he had interacted with in FUT, Minna adding that he was equally impressed with the members of the University Congregation.

The Chairman said that given the cardinal responsibility of the Senate in a university, the fate of the University is entrusted in the hand of the Senate.

Obafemi observed Prof. that though the University is doing well in the area of winning research grants and TETFund projects, more can still be achieved

The Chairman further assured that the Council shall work directly with Senate to achieve progress and productivity.

He acknowledged that FUT, Minna is designated Centre of Excellence in many areas and pledged to lead

a united Council to work with the Senate to achieve more successes for the University.

At the inception of the interactive session, the Vice-Chancellor of the University, Professor Abdullahi Bala, fsssn, urged the Senate members to bare their minds on their areas of concern.

During the interactive sessions, members raised a number of issues including funding of specialised universities, curriculum review and staff welfare among others.

Leaders of all the staff unions also spoke during the session with the Congregation.

Responding, the Chairman gave assurances that he would subsequently meet with the leaderships of the respective unions for further discussions on their areas of concern.

Prof. Obafemi further assured of a more unified university irrespective of the majorityminority dichotomy existing in the country.

In his closing remarks, the Vice-Chancellor enthused: "We are assured and reassured that the Council will help in moving the Senate forward."

Speaking during a live interview session at the institutions campus radio Search FM 92.3, monitored by CAMPUS NEWS the Chairman of Council reiterated that the Senate and Congregation are "vibrant" and "wonderful."

He noted that the University has credible and wonderful programmes but further opined that no matter how good the academics are, they cannot succeed without good facilities, hence the need to provide more facilities.

On the challenges facing the institution, the **Pro-Chancellor** 

identified the dearth of hostel accommodation as the most obvious, adding that the available hostels can only accommodate less than 10 percent of the student population.

He maintained that living in the hostel offers the advantages of interaction, cross fertilisation and exchange of ideas just as it is more secured than staying off campus.

Obafemi pledged unanimity of Council to move the University forward.

The members of Council were later taken on a tour of facilities at the Campus, Gidan Main Kwano. accompanied by Principal Officers of the University.

Members of the new Council are the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Abdullahi Bala, fsssn; Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic), Faruk Adamu Kuta; Vice-Chancellor Deputy (Administration), Prof. Emmanuel Emeka Udensi, fnip, and Hon.

Others are Hon. Cletus Obun, Alh. Tanko M. Salisu, Dr. Chike Onwe and Mal. Ahmed Yahaya Alhassan (Convocation Representative).

Profs. Adamu Yusuf Kabiru, Peter Aba Idah, Abdullahi Mohammed and Rasheed Olakunle Ojutiku of the departments of Biochemistry, Agricultural and **Bioresources** Engineering, Civil Engineering and Water Resources, Aquaculture and Fisheries Technology respectively serving as Senate are Representatives on the University's apex decision making body. The Registrar, Mr. Amos Nmadu Kolo is the Secretary to Council.

The representative of the Federal Ministry of Education is expected to be named soon, just as two representatives o f the Congregation will be elected shortly to give the Council its full complement.

#### PROF EGENA MAKES CASE FOR COLLABORATIVE RESEARCH **FUNDING**

rof. Acheneje Stephen Egena, of the Sunday Department Animal of Production Technology, Federal University of Technology, Minna has made a case for collaborative funding of research in the area of animal breeding.

The consummate professor of

Animal Production stated this on Thursday, August 5, 2021, when he delivered the 87th Inaugural Lecture of the University titled: Animal Protein Security and the Animal Breeder: What Relationship? at the University Auditorium, Main Campus, Gidan Kwano.

Prof. Egena posited that funding of agricultural research should not be left for government alone, adding that it should also be done by the farmers' association, consumers, businessmen and businesswomen.

On the changing nature of research environment, the don advocated for the procurement of top-notch equipment by government needed for genomic selection to improve farm animals. He also noted that there is need for proper record keeping for both quantitative and genomic study of traits of economic importance of the animals.

Furthermore, the Professor of Animal Production stated that government policy should ensure the production of a "super cow" for enhanced milk production from local cattle and chickens so that they would measure up to the exotic ones in meatiness and egg production potential.

On how to reduce wastage, he called for support services in the areas of processing, haulage, storage, marketing of animal products and electricity supply so that the farm produce would get to the final consumers in good condition and at very competitive prices.

While delivering his address at the event, the Vice-Chancellor of the University, Prof. Abdullahi Bala, fsssn, commended Prof. Egena for doing the needful by delivering his inaugural lecture and welcomed him into the league of Professors in FUT, Minna who have delivered their Inaugural Lectures. The Vice-Chancellor further appealed to other professors in the University to follow suit, especially those in Department of Animal Production.

Prof. Bala expressed appreciation Pro-Chancellor the Chairman, Governing Council of the University, Prof. Olu Obafemi for finding time out of his busy schedule to attend the event and other dignitaries thanked gracing the event.
