

# **PROF OLUGBOJI OFFERS PANACEA FOR PIPELINE VANDALIZATION**

s part of concerted efforts to address the incessant cases of pipeline vandalization in the country, Prof. Oluwafemi Ayodeji Olugboji of the Department of Mechanical Engineering, School of Infrastructure, Process and Engineering Technology, Federal University of Technology, Minna has called for the use of reverse engineering techniques in the oil and gas and water resources sectors.

The scholar stated this when he delivered the 95th Inaugural

Lecture of the University titled: Problems to Solutions or Solutions to Problems: Reverse Engineering in a Dynamic World on Thursday, November 25, 2021 at the University Auditorium, Main Campus.

Prof. Olugboji stated that the use of reverse engineering techniques would accelerate early detection of damaged pipeline location, causes and solutions, adding that there is a need to reliable set up mechanisms to sustain constant

operation and to prevent the loss of petroleum products.

"This medium of transportation is usually attributed to very sensitive products such as crude oil, natural gas and industrial chemicals, in which an unintended pause in their operation result in the loss of millions of dollars.

The design and application of pipeline detectors is made around the properties of the product that is being transported and expected

nature of damage to the system", the University don disclosed.

He revealed that there are different techniques used to detect and locate pipeline damage, ranging from simple visual inspection to complicated satellite based hyper-spectral imaging, saying that each has its own advantages and impediments.

Prof. Olugboji described reverse engineering as a process in which software, machines, aircraft, architectural structures and other products are deconstructed to extract design information from them. He noted that the main aim of reverse engineering is to infer, analyse and understand through interplay, the functional and regulatory mechanisms of various systems.

The Inaugural Lecturer called for joint investigation and application of the proposed approach with relevant government agencies towards solving the problems of pipeline vandalisation and wastage of water due to leakages to water pipelines in the country.

Some of Prof. Olugboji's contribution to knowledge, as he disclosed, include the design, construction and testing of a poultry feed pellet machine, petroleum pipeline monitoring using an internet of things platforms, problems of calculating time delay between pulse arrivals, the development of a steam powered incubator with solar supported system, design and fabrication of rice de-stoning machine among others.

Speaking at the well-attended event, the Vice-Chancellor of the University, Prof. Abdullahi Bala, fsssn, represented by the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic), Prof. Faruk Adamu Kuta commended Prof. Olugboji for delivering his inaugural lecture. He thanked all the invited guests for attending the lecture and wished them safe trip back to their various destinations.

"We make it a duty and top priority job to make sure that schools that teach URP that are eligible for registration are visited as often as possible to make sure that they are up to date with what is being taught globally," he reiterated.

In his response, the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Abdullahi Bala, FSSSN appreciated the team leader and his members for agreeing to come to Minna for the exercise because of recent, Niger State has had a very bad press about banditry. "So for you shows your be here to commitment. only not to TOPREC but to the University system and Nigeria as a whole and we see it as a sacrifice and selfless duty that must be done," he said.

Prof. Bala further thanked TOPREC for their understanding as the exercise should have taken place last year but for COVID-19 and ASUU strike.

## FUTMINNA, MULTI-MINERALS NIGERIA LTD UNVEIL BLOCK INDUSTRY

he Federal University of Technology, Minna in collaboration with Multi-Minerals Nigeria Limited has unveiled a modern block industry in furtherance of a memorandum of understanding (MOU) signed by both parties on February 28, 2019.

The unveiling ceremony which was performed by the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Abdullahi Bala, fsssn, took place on Friday, November 26, 2021 at the Main Campus, beside Masoyi Farms, Gidan Kwano.

Delivering his remarks at the ceremony, the Vice-Chancellor who expressed his excitement over the passion and foresight exhibited by the Multi-Minerals Nigeria Limited, described the project as a viable one adding that the company remained a strategic investor for the University.

He disclosed that the initial idea that brought about the partnership between the University and the company was on farming considering the fact that the University is sitting on a large expanse of land totaling about 10,600 hectres, with only a small portion of it currently being utilized.

Prof. Bala said that the idea of venturing into block making was later arrived at in order to better utilize the resources available in the University, provide another source of revenue and expose students to real practical training with a view to establishing a close link between the town and the gown and between the University and industries.

"We believe our students being the exposed to kind of machineries, the kind of work ethics and the kind of agronomic practices that will come to bear, will go a long way in benefiting them as they will not only learn but also gain the skills needed to themselves to be selfprepare employed when they leave the University " the VC reiterated.

Prof. Bala further explained that the collaboration is not only beneficial to the parties involved but also the host community and the humanity at large, noting that the host community would substantially benefit in terms of provision of labour, skills and modern techniques which require minimal human efforts.

He stressed the need for the host community to give maximum cooperation to ensure peace and harmonious coexistence so as to achieve the desired goal.

The Vice-Chancellor also stressed the need for ensuring efficiency and quality outputs, adding that as a university of technology going into the market to compete with others, it should be seen to be operating at a higher level, using modern technology in a manner that others can see the benefits and begin to adapt.

He further encouraged students to embark on the students' industrial works experience in Small and Medium Enterprises (SME) around where they will be trained and prepared for selfemployment and be ready to stand on their own after graduation instead of doing their SIWES in places that have little or no relevance to what they have learnt.

Speaking earlier, the MD/CEO, Multi-Minerals Nigeria Limited, Mrs. Titilayo Eunice Oyewole disclosed that the company imported a semi automatic block making machine from China with the capacity of producing over 1,800 blocks per day, an indication of their preparedness to meet demands.

Mrs. Oyewole who thanked the Vice-Chancellor for giving and creating a conducive environment for the project to start, also called on the University to encourage its contractors to patronize the block industry as it would result in making money for the mutual benefit of the parties to the MOU.
