n a bid to ensuring that Africa Centres of Excelthe lence for development Impact ( ACE IMPACT) achieve international accreditation as well as to ascertain quality of academic programmes, the National Universities Commission ( NUC) has visited the University for resource verification and accreditation assessment of 3 new Post graduate academic programmes M. Tech and PhD in namely, Toxicology, Molecular Biology & Bioinformatic and Food Safety of the Africa Centre of Excellence for Mycotoxin and Food Safety ( ACEMFS) domiciled in the Federal University of Technology, Minna.

The accreditation teams who paid the Management of the Institution a courtesy visit on arrival were received on Monday, March 14, 2022 at the University Senate Chamber, Main campus by the Vice - Chancellor, Prof. Abdullahi Bala fsssn who was represented by the Deputy Vice- Chancellor (Administration) Prof. Emmanuel Udensi.

In his welcome address ,the Vice-Chancellor disclosed that management places premium on the Centre and has worked hard to support it right from its emergence.

He pointed out that the accreditation will be of great benefit to the University adding that the University seeks several accreditation opportunities within and out side the country.

# FUT MINNA INNOVATES SMART IRRIGATIONSYSTEMBy Abdullahi U. Danbakaba

team of researchers from the Federal University of Technology, Minna has innovated a Smart Irrigation System to avail farmers of the opportunity to apply modern

technology with a view to abrogate the tediousness involved in the traditional irrigation farming methods.

The Principal investigator of the

research team, Engr. Prof. Elizabeth N. Onwuka of the Department of Telecommunications Engineering disclosed this at a workshop organized to

sensitize a team of agricultural extension workers drawn from across Niger State on the Smart Irrigation system. The Workshop was held on Monday, March 14, 2022 at the University's Main Campus, Gidan Kwano.

The Smart Irrigation System which is a TETFunds research grant project currently at its experimental stage is centred at conservations of water and labour to ensure cost efficiency, avoid wastage of resources and improve productivity.

The principal investigator stated that the project sought to provide an interface between the farmer and his farm through the application of the Internet of a Thing (IoT) to enable interconnectivity between the Internet Cloud and the farm by the help of some installed sensors and electronic nodes which allows the farmer to access the activities in the farm via a smart phone or a computer device from wherever he is; thus, making the practice less tedious.

She added that, the sensors which were installed in some sections of the farm collect information about the amount of moisture in the soil, the level of temperature as well as humidity in the farm and subsequently send signals to the electronic nodes which determines should be whether irrigation triggered or other wise.

Prof. Onwuka who further stressed that the essence of the project is to help irrigation farmers save water, reduce cost and increase yield in order to produce more food for the increasingly growing population of the country, also said that, the participants were carefully selected considering the vital role they play in sensitizing farmers on new trends in farming.

In his comments, the Deputy Director, Research, Niger State Agricultural Management Development Agency (NAMDA), Dr. Adenrele Adeleke expressed his appreciation and gave assurance that the new technology would get to the farmers adding that the workshop had undoubtedly updated their knowledge and experience in the field of agricultural extension.

The participants were conducted round the smart irrigation site where they observed the effectiveness of the system and expressed optimism that the project would yield a good result.

Prof. Onwuka, who is the principal investigator of the research team stated this while speaking on the benefits of the project during an interactive session with a team of technologists drawn from relevant departments of the University on Tuesday, March 15, 2022 at the Main Campus, Gidan Kwano.

Prof. Onwuka stressed that there is need for technologists to be involved in the ongoing project because of the crucial position they occupied in terms of installations and maintenance of the electronic gadgets employed in the project. She added, "these are electronic nodes, so, when installing it in the farm, technologists need to be redeployed to ensure that they are properly installed. While the electronic and telecommunication technologists handle the installation and maintenance, the Agricul-

ture technologists need to determine at what depth to install for certain crops for it is not the same depth for every crop."

The participants were conducted round the smart irrigation site where they were enlighten on how the system works.
